Gay and Lesbian

refers to the sexual orientation of people toward their own sex. Men who love men refer to themselves as gay. Women who love women call themselves lesbian. 2–5% of the population is gay or lesbian.

Bisexuality

is the sexual orientation of people toward both men and women. Men as well as women can be bisexual. The degree to which one is attracted to a man and a woman may vary greatly. One may be more attracted to women than to men and vice versa.

Transsexuality

or transgender identity is the permanent inner certainty of belonging to the opposite of one's birth gender. This includes the rejection of the physical characteristics of anatomical gender and the role expectations associated with it. Transsexual people often feel the need to go through gender reassignment procedures via hormonal and surgical measures, followed by social and legal recognition to live in the desired gender.

Rainbow-NAC is a private interest group of gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender and transsexual Christians within the New Apostolic Church. It was founded in 1999 and is open to family members, friends and people of different faith.

Church

Rainbow-NAC has an ongoing dialogue and a close cooperation with the New Apostolic Church since 2003. Representatives of the Church meet with Rainbow-NAC on an annual basis to discuss the needs of LGBT brothers and sisters and to coordinate the common work.

In many countries, regional groups cooperate closely with their Apostles and District Apostles. Upon the invitation of the Church, Rainbow-NAC leads workshops for congregations or youth groups, and is regularly visible at youth days or church conventions. Rainbow-NAC is currently working with the District Churches of Switzerland/Austria to create a guideline for individual pastoral care for LGBT brothers and sisters.
